

"Costumes, Candy, and Caution!"

Emphasize vigilance and defensive driving during trick-or-treat hours. Children and families will be out in full force—your awareness can prevent tragedy.



SAFE HALLOWEEN FOR DRIVERS



Slow down in neighborhoods
Children can dart into streets unexpectedly.



Stay alert after dark
Use headlights early and double-check blind spots



Avoid distractions
No phones, eating, or GPS adjustments while moving



Be patient
Expect extra pedestrian and vehicle traffic around residential areas



Check vehicle lights
Make sure headlights, brake lights, and turn signals are working before heading out



MORE SAFETY TIPS FOR HALLOWEEN



Walk with a grown-up
Children should be supervised while trick-or-treating



Carry a flashlight
Help see and be seen in the dark



Use caution with costumes
Avoid long or loose items and wear bright colors



Inspect treats
Check all candy and goodies for signs of tampering
